

## **Abstract Preparation Instruction**

### **1) English Instructions for Participants**

#### **How to Prepare Your Abstract File**

Please prepare your abstract strictly following the required structure described below. All components must be included in the submitted Word file, and formatting should remain consistent with the template:

##### **1. Title**

Provide a concise scientific title of **10–15 words** (maximum 20 words). Capitalize major words. Avoid abbreviations unless essential.

##### **2. Authors**

List all authors using the format:

**First Name + Last Name**, followed by superscripted affiliation numbers.  
Example:

Author One<sup>1\*</sup>, Author Two<sup>2</sup>, Author Three<sup>1</sup>

Mark the **corresponding author** with an asterisk.

##### **3. Affiliations**

Provide institutional affiliations with matching superscript numbering. Include department, institute, university, and country.

##### **4. Corresponding Author**

Write the full name and a valid email address of the corresponding author.

##### **5. Abstract (Max. 250 words)**

The abstract should include four clearly defined sections **without section headings inside the text**:

- **Background:** Briefly explain the problem or motivation.

- **Materials and Methods:** Summarize key datasets, tools, or procedures.
- **Results:** Present the main findings concisely.
- **Conclusion:** State the significance and potential impact of the work.

Do not include references, figures, or tables in the abstract text.

## 6. Keywords (5–6 items)

List 5–6 keywords separated by commas. Start each keyword with a capital letter.

## Important

- **All abstracts must be written and submitted in English.** Submissions in other languages will not be accepted.
- **All grey instructional text** in the template is for guidance only and **must be deleted before final submission.**
